

Home learning L4L year 6 Summer 1 2020:

Week 1: Pollution

Make a presentation, leaflet or poster about the types of pollution that is most common in the world today. You can concentrate on one type of pollution (e.g. plastics in the ocean) or you could explain a variety of issues. Please explain why these types of pollution have become an issue in the last few years and what could be done by humans to reduce it. This can be done on the computer or on paper, it needs to have written facts as well as pictures/illustrations and colour.

Week 2: Recycling (title)

On a piece of paper please explain how you recycle at home – which colour bins do you have and what rubbish goes in which bin? You can draw this out if you want to.

Please research online and find out what the three 'Rs' of recycling are – please write what they are and explain what we mean by these terms.

Explain why it is important to recycle as well as what materials can be recycled. What can we recycle these materials into?

Finally explain what all humans can do to reduce our carbon footprint so that the planet is less polluted.

Week 3: "What is a democratic community?"

Task 1: Research the following words and write your definition:

- Democracy
- Government
- Parliament
- Prime Minister
- Oligarchy
- Autocracy

Please explain why democracy is the fairest way of ruling a country and if you can compare it to other types of rule around the world (e.g. North Korea – is this country a democracy?).

Task 2: explain why we have laws (rules) – what would happen if we had no laws?

Research and explain how laws are made in Parliament.

Week 4: "Political parties"

Do some research into what political parties we have in the UK and name the top 5 parties. Draw their logo and explain briefly what they stand for/their most important issues.
