
Starter: Think of at least 2 examples of good manners and bad manners.

Imagine the following situations and then discuss your opinion and ideas with the rest of the group.

1. You are waiting to get on the bus. You start to push and shove other kids out of the way and rush to get on the bus before the people who were queuing.

What is wrong with this situation? What is wrong with your manners and how should you wait for and behave on the bus? What do you think the other people think of you?

 You are with your mates in a local shop. There are adults in the shop too.
 You and your mates start to point and laugh at one old lady's hat. You poke fun at her and start to use bad language.

How have you shown a lack of respect? How would the lady and the others in the shop have felt?

3. Some younger kids are walking along the street. A group of teenagers are standing outside the mobile phone shop. As the younger kids walk past, they spit on the pavement and laugh.

How would the younger kids have felt? Why is it bad manners to spit? What problems do you think this would cause the shop owner? Would other customers want to go past them to get in the shop?

AGREE OR DISAGRE E




- Some kids think it's cool to show disrespect to people and to use bad manners.
- Our role models are people we look up to and respect. Sometimes we copy their behaviour. If they show lack of respect, so do we.
- When I show a lack of respect, it's because I don't care about other people.
- No one can tell me how to behave.
- My behaviour has to be appropriate to the time, the place and the situation.

You have the option to be polite, courteous and show respect. But, if you choose not to, there are consequences.

2	" When my teacher asks me to wait outside, should I refuse and give him loads of backchat?"	
3.	"On the bus, should I start shouting abuse at the man sitting opposite? Shall I laugh at him and put my feet on the seats?"	
4	"Shall I backchat my teacher while chewing in her face? Shall I swing on my chair and totally disrespect her just to show off to my mates?"




Why are manners, courtesy and showing respect important?


